

Base Six - L. Estes - Excelcia

Full sounds and strong melodies, big impacts, and the perfect balance of levelappropriate dynamics and articulations make this an outstanding and intense concert opener, all while using just the first six notes of the B-flat scale. Your beginners will sound like seasoned veterans at their first concert! 1:58





Blackbeard - R. Standridge - Randall Standridge Music

Sail the high seas in this exciting work for beginning band! Written to sound much more mature than a beginning work, this exciting adventure in 3/4 time only uses seven different rhythms and a six-note range to create an achievable challenge to spur the growth of your young mateys! Pirate chants and bombastic percussion, as well as introductions to first/second endings and D.C. al Coda, make this a work that your developing musicians are sure to love! Rated ARRGH! 1:58





Creep It Real – C. Bernotas – Hal Leonard





Creep it Real, by Chris M. Bernotas, is the perfect selection for your fall or Halloween concert! This creeptastic piece uses only the first few notes taught in most method books and will set a haunted mood by using minor-key modality and optional glissando effects for the trombones. Exuberance - R. Meeboer - Eighth Note Publications

Exuberance is the perfect piece to introduce young performers to band music. Focusing on the first seven pitches introduced in most method books, this piece makes use of simple compositional techniques to help your band evolve from playing unison melodies into sounding like a mature band. Each section has melodic content at some point in the piece, giving each performer the opportunity to shine. 1:50





GALLANT FANFARE



Gallant Fanfare - M. Oare - Hal Leonard

With nothing faster than a quarter note (except 8ths in percussion) this terrific piece for first-year players features a noble and stately style with enough variety in scoring to provide a rewarding experience. A great opener for that first concert! 4:30









GrooVE! - M. Putman - Wingert-Jones

This cleverly titled work for beginning musicians is tons of fun! An infectious groove will have your audiences tapping their toes and your musicians asking to play this one again and again. 1:56.









Skysplitter Fanfare sounds quite mature yet is extremely playable by beginning ensembles. Driving percussion parts are designed to accommodate large or small sections, and wind players only see quarter, half, and whole notes. Brian Balmages has written a significant powerhouse opener for your youngest musicians! 1:30







Tirade - R. Sheldon - Alfred



Set in the Dorian mode, Tirade, by Robert Sheldon, offers young musicians the opportunity to perform with passion and emotion to make a bold musical statement. Since there are no dotted rhythms, articulations, or 8th notes (other than in the percussion section), and using only the first five notes the students have learned, this is a perfect piece for a beginning band's first concert! Wizards Of The West - S. O'Loughlin - Excelcia

Beginner music that sounds nothing like beginner music. This cinematic gem captures all the emotion and sound of a mature band work but is playable at your band's first concert. A must-have! 2:56



6-Note Santa (Jolly Old St. Nicholas) – J. Compello – Carl Fischer



This arrangement of Jolly Old Saint Nicholas is perfect for the beginning band winter concert. Based on the first 6 notes of the concert Bb scale, the scoring ensures every instrument gets a chance to play the rhythmically simple melody. The only eighth notes appear in the snare drum part. Written with the composer's typical expertise for a great sounding and easy-to-put together composition. 1:40






Using only the first six notes of the Bb scale, composer/arranger Tyler Arcari found a way to combine, in quodlibet, four classic carols into a delightful setting for the youngest of band musicians. Your first-year students will shine as they delight audiences with I Saw Three Ships, Patapan, in Dulci Jubilo, and Deck the Halls. 2:11






After The Rain – M. Neufeld – Randall Standridge Music

Mallet percussion, percussion effects, and snapping from the wind players create the sound of a gentle rain as beautiful chords and melodies swell and recede from the wind consort. Written to be accessible to younger players, this gorgeous lyrical work will provide your ensemble with opportunities for expressive playing and tone development. Castlewood – T. Stakem – Southern Music Company

Melodic, energetic, and right in the wheelhouse of first-year players. Claves and tambourine are introduced, so there is a little something for the percussion section, too. The perfect selection to make your beginner band's first concert performance a success! 1:20

Fasten your seatbelts for this aggressive and harmonically colorful work! Clutch is an intense experience, using percussion to establish a strong rhythmic pulse that compliments the powerful melodic lines throughout. While the piece has an amazingly complex sound and vivid imagery, Brian Balmages has once again managed to do so with music that sounds difficult but is surprisingly achievable for young musicians!








The Conquerors – J. Martin – Alfred/Ludwig Masters

Heroic themes for everyone in Jeremy S. Martin's The Conquerors---scored safely for ultimate success highlight this outstanding work for grade 1 band. There is opportunity for teaching chromatic fingerings in clarinet and tenor saxophone.

Ranges are limited to the usual six notes in most beginning band methods with only 1 possible new note in any part.





The Haunted Granary – B. Munroe – Alfred/Ludwig Masters



Some vocalizations and the use of a flexatone highlight this beginning band tour de force. Only the standard first six notes are used and even percussion plays no notes shorter than eighth notes. The Haunted Granary by Brian Monroe makes for an excellent first concert selection.





The Ice Zone - A. Branchfield - Alfred/Ludwig Masters

Stark lines and open harmonies give The Ice Zone by Aric Branchfield a mature sound without difficulty. Clarinet stays below the break, trumpet below B, and all instruments lie within a carefully thought-out range for first year players.




At Max Power! - A. Webb - Alfred

Galactic Nature, by Victor López, for beginning band, is captivating and perfect for integrating music into cross-curricular studies. Inspired by the systems of stars and interstellar matter that make the universe, this composition provides an effective way of connecting music with celestial scientific concepts. 2:00







Gentle Song and Jubilation - R. Saucedo - Hal Leonard

Providing a great opportunity to teach two distinct styles to young players, Gentle Song and Jubilation is also an appealing festival or concert piece. The opening lyric section uses the mallet percussion to anchor the pulse accompanying a flowing melody, while the fast, marcato section features the percussion driving the excitement and energy for the full ensemble. 2:40

This Latin style dance has a taste of American jazz and Afro-Cuban music. Popular in the 1940s and 1950s, the mambo is once again all the rage. 


Red Comet - M. Oare - Hal Leonard

Resilience - Pinkzebra - Pinkzebra Publishing - Flex Verision

This beautiful and haunting piece, with lyrical melodies projecting strength and determination, is like a modern chorale with film score undertones, providing an opportunity for band members to focus on tone and shape emotionally dramatic phrases. Great for a concert program needing a short piece to provide a contrast in mood and energy.






Serenata – J. Compello – Carl Fischer

Suitable for performance at the end of the first year of instruction, this Latin-dance-flavored composition is an excellent study in independent playing for young bands. With steady percussion, bass staccato articulations, clarinet and horn ostinatos, and muted trumpets, there are many teaching moments presented. Program this for a lighter moment in your concert that will still let you teach important musical concepts. 2:28





Tantrum – T. Freshner – Kjos

Tantrum depicts a full-blown emotional meltdown with stomping rhythms from percussion, grumpy melodies from the low brass, and whiny cries from the woodwinds and trombones! Engaging contrapuntal lines will help develop independent playing in your young band all while staying within a limited range of pitches. 
Primeval Dance – B. Balmages – Alfred/Makemusic


Too Much Percussion! - R. Standridge - Randall Standridge Music






Apex Predator – M. Oare – Hal Leonard

In every ecosystem, an "apex predatory" is an animal existing at the very top of the food chain; never preyed upon themselves. Michael Oare's programmatic work opens with a haunting flute solo accompanied by various mysterious effects. The pace then quickens as we explore the intensity, danger, and majesty connected with these magnificent natural hunters. 3:50







El Manto Dorado (Concert March) – R. Standridge – Randall Standridge Music

This style of march, the pasodoble, is popular in Spain and Mexico and with mariachi groups. Commonly used in bullfights, the most popular ones were named after famous bullfighters; this title may be translated as "The Golden Cape." Driving rhythms and memorable melodies abound in this dazzling offering that will showcase the best in your developing musicians at your next festival or concert performance.





Flight of the Thunderbird - R. Saucedo - Hal Leonard/Flex-Band



First published in 2004, Richard Saucedo's Flight of the Thunderbird has remained a popular choice for contest and festival for younger players. Skillfully scored in this new edition for flexible instrumentation, this exciting work in one tempo will sound great with an ensemble of any size.







In Solitude - T. Stalter - Alfred

Sometimes we seek solitude on purpose. Occasionally, we are left in it. Solitude can often be a calming and relaxing experience but also an anxious and fearful one. In Solitude, by Todd Stalter, is expressive, intimate music that seeks to connect with the different emotions we experience while alone. Featuring cinematic techniques like Lydian scale movement and appoggiaturas, the atmospheric sound of *In Solitude* is sure to resonate both musically and personally with performers and audiences. 2:35

In Zach Docter's *Prairie Dance*, every instrument gets a chance to shine. A simple tune starts in the clarinets. As it's passed through the ensemble, it grows louder before culminating in a rhythmic Americana-esque hoedown that would make Copland proud. After this spirited climax, the tune winds down before ending quietly with the clarinets, precisely as it began. Every instrument group is featured in this piece. 1:50







Scarborough Fantasy – R. A. Carter/C. Huss – Carl Fischer

This hauntingly beautiful composition features both beautiful original and traditional melodies with lush harmonic construction. Performers will experience expressive playing in minor keys amidst a lyrical, legato flow. With an emotional key change and multiple musically dramatic moments for every section, this inspiring composition offers a modern take on a timeless classic.





Shakespeare Meets Godzilla – R. Buckley – Hal Leonard/Flex Band

Here is a flex version of Robert's popular work for full band which colorfully depicts the madness and mayhem as musical worlds collide. An inventive mash-up of Renaissance and classic horror music, *Shakespeare Meets Godzilla* is entertaining but still with plenty of musical depth for teaching.

In this uplifting composition for wind band, the metaphor of a wishing stone is used as a place to seek answers to life's questions and make wishes for prosperity, happiness, lifelong friendships, peace, and unity. The music creates a tranquil and reflective atmosphere, with soaring melodies and driving rhythms building to a powerful crescendo that inspires hope, friendship, and perseverance.





Three Minutes to Midnight – J. Hall – Alfred/Makemusic



It's a race against the clock in this unique musical countdown that keeps listeners on the edge of their seats. *Three Minutes to Midnight* includes moments of eerie apprehension, which increase in tension as they build into heavy, raucous statements with great intensity. The *Dies Irae* theme pops in and out of the texture, introducing a sinister motif that indicates something much darker. 2:40



Centrifugal Force – D. Gillingham – C. Alan Publications

Set in D locrian mode (with notes of the E-flat major scale), this is a dark, engaging work that plays with the word "Centrifugal," which refers to the force that acts on objects within a rotating frame, directing them away away from the axis (e.g. the scrambler or tilt-a-whirl rides at a state fair). Gillingham also masterfully crafts a spinning fugue, which gives each section of the ensemble a chance in the spotlight.





Emblazoned – B. Balmages – Alfred/Makemusic



As the title *Emblazoned* suggests, this euphoric celebration will undoubtedly make its mark on your students and audience! Simple polyrhythms combine with an engaging melody, heroic countermelodies, and riveting percussion writing to create an energetic yet exceptionally playable work. Even better, Brian Balmages has orchestrated the piece so that it achieves a high level of power! 3:30






FANFARE FOR THE GOLD TYLER S. GRANT

Go With The Flow – J. de Haan – De Haske/Hal Leonard

This work is not only about the flow of the Doubs, Ranceuse, and Roide rivers that converge at Pont-de-Roide but also about the flow of life and history of this French town. The composition begins festively and, after the tempo picks up, the music smoothly and rhythmically depicts the happiness and enthusiasm of the inhabitants. A beautiful piece but will take time to bring in – plan ahead. 6:14





Jovian Farewell - M. Sweeney - Hal Leonard

Jovian Farewell is a carefully paced memorial work, with the title referring to the planet Jupiter and the music incorporating the famous chorale by Gustav Holst. The familiar melody is hinted at early, then developed through a series of layers and phases with building intensity. The full chorale emerges near the end, then tapers peacefully to a tender close. 3:50







La Valiente – A. Webb – Northeastern Music Publications

La Valiente is a rousing Spanish piece that combines flamenco, tango, and just plain fun that's sure to be a bright spot on any group's next concert. Written in d minor, it modulates approximately halfway through to a happier sounding F major, but as the piece concludes, students find themselves back in d minor. 3:50


